Learn how to claim Worker's Compensation Benefits up to \$56,752.00 for your hearing loss and receive a FREE hearing loss screening test. Generally, if you worked in a noisy environment (such as a factory) your hearing was probably damaged somewhat by the constant exposure to noise over a period of time. You may have been a construction worker, a policeman or fireman, daycare worker, office worker or nearly any occupation which has a loud working environment. Workplace noise is a problem in many jobs. Under **WI State Workers Compensation** law noise in the work environment **doesn't have to be the sole cause of your hearing loss!** As we age some hearing loss is normal but is easily differentiated from hearing loss due to loud working conditions.

In order to receive any Workers Compensation Benefits for your hearing loss you must no longer be working in a noisy environment. Many people do this by retiring but there are other reasons as well (laid-off, employer no longer in business, change to a quieter working environment, ..). So if you've left your noisy job *it's not too late* – it may be just the right time!

Hearing Loss Screening Testing is provided by **Sound Advisors** which is an informational service of **Johnson Law Offices**.



Persons found to have a hearing loss will be provided information about obtaining a full hearing loss exam to determine actual level of loss.

Not all claims qualify for benefits and award size varies.

There is *no obligation* to use Johnson Law Offices to obtain benefits.
